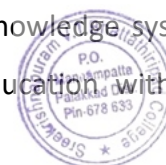
Vision:

Students were absent during the visit, and the visits were conducted strictly per COVID protocol. A questionnaire was prepared based on the NAAC criteria.

8. Administrative Office

Financial and Administrative planning of the institution is good.

● Criteria wise observation

Criteria I: Curricular Aspects

- The academic year 2019-20, the University of Calicut implemented new UG/PG Regulations.
- During the academic year, the Institution provided 13 courses, including certificates, diplomas, and value-added programs.
- During this year, a significant 13 courses were attended by students, with 548 completing them. This accounts for 61.29% of the student population benefiting from these programs.
- Integration of Professional Ethics, Gender, Human Values, Environment, and Sustainability is through curricular and Cocurricular activities.
- In 2019-20, 35.73% of students actively participated in project work, internships, and industrial visits.
- The Institution started a centre for research named *Vaikhari* Centre for Research in Kerala Heritage.
- The Institution collected feedback from stakeholders.

Criteria II: Teaching, Learning and Evaluation

- In the academic year, 94.11% of sanctioned Seats are filled, and 89.71% of Reserved seats are filled against the reserved seats.
- Approximately 84.85% of full-time teachers hold NET/SET/Ph.D. qualifications, underscoring the strong academic foundation of the faculty. The student-full-time-teacher ratio remained at 27.09 for the academic year.
- 77.07% of the students qualified for the UG/PG examination in the year.
- Student-centric learning experiences: Discussions and Debates, Creating educational videos in the Media Lab, Peer teaching, Nataka Kalari (Theatre workshops), Students' Seminars and Conferences, Roleplay, Skit, Internships, Exhibitions and Trade Fairs are
- Internal Assessment System: Internal assessments follow University regulations and employ an Internal Examination Committee. The continuous assessment components are Assignments, Seminars or Viva, and internal examinations. Internal marks are uploaded after checking by the students, and grievances are redressed in a timely manner.

Criteria III – Research, Consultancy and Extension

- This Institution received grants totalling INR 16,25,000 as the first instalment of the UGC STRIDE project on the topic 'Vedic Education System in Kerala – A Comprehensive, Scientific, and Interdisciplinary Analysis' for research-related activities.



- A total of 11 workshops, seminars, and conferences were conducted during the academic year.
- Faculty members published only 4 research papers in journals during the academic year.
- Faculty members contributed significantly to academia by publishing 21 books, chapters in edited volumes, and papers in national/international conference proceedings.
- The Institution initiated 35 extension programmes through NSS and Staff Club, including 2 house constructions in the Home for Homeless and Flood Relief Programmes
- project. Institution has received 8 Awards for NSS Unit, Programme Officer and Volunteer. Various other awards and recognitions were received for the Institution's impactful extension activities and dedication to social responsibility.
- There are 9 new MoUs, collaborations/linkages during the academic year.

Criteria IV: Infrastructure and Learning Resources

Criteria V: Student Support and Progression

- Approximately 78.01% of students benefitted from scholarships and free ships, enhancing accessibility to education during the 2019-20 academic year.
- The students were provided various opportunities to build their capacities. The institute has organized 3 ICT and computer-related training, 4 language and communication skill development classes, 6 life skill classes, and 6 soft skill development classes.
- In 2019-20, 39.17% of students received guidance for competitive examinations and career counselling.
- VTB College already has a grievance committee, Anti-ragging committee and Internal Compliant Committee established in the college.
- Only 5% of outgoing students are placed or progressed
- Among the outgoing students, 2 students have qualified for state/ national/level qualifying examinations.
- During year 12, medals were secured by the students for their outstanding performance in sports and arts.
- The number of sports and cultural programs in which students of the Institution participated during the year is 21.
- The Alumni Association financially supports meritorious students through scholarships.
- Alumni act as resource persons in workshops/ conferences/seminars.

Criteria VI: Governance, Leadership and Management



- VTB College demonstrates a comprehensive alignment between governance and its vision/ mission.
- VTB College's governance structure and decisions are guided by its vision and mission.
- The college implements the strategic plan through a decentralized administration through diverse committees and adherence to regulations.
- A comprehensive performance appraisal system, effective welfare measures, and career development opportunities promote staff performance.
- Institutions try to find funding from various sources.
- E-Governance: In the year, the institute started e-governance for various functions, including financial transactions (PFMS), enhancing transparency.
- All the Institution's faculty members were provided financial support to attend conferences/ workshops.
- Out of the Institution's total staff (teaching and non-teaching), 90% had attended FDP, MDP, and Professional Development/Administrative training programs during the year.
- IQAC initiated Seminar on MOOC development and it served as FDP to give an insight to faculty for E Content Development.

Criteria VII: Innovations and Best Practice

- In 2019-20 Institution started a gender audit to ensure gender equity Institution.
- The college has a "Gender Policy".
- The Women's Cell has been vital in organizing various awareness programs.
- The college's Green policy reflects a commitment to environmental sustainability.
- VTB College actively promotes diversity across cultural, regional, linguistic, and socioeconomic dimensions. The college organizes co-curricular programmes for inclusivity through various clubs and NSS.
- Best practices highlight Institution's commitment to Indigenous Cultural heritage, environment sustainability and social welfare
- Institution started a *Vaikhari* Centre for Research in Kerala Heritage, which submitted a proposal for UGC STRIDE Component 1 and the project was accepted by UGC.
- *Spandanam* –The programme positively impacted society and the environment, fostering responsible citizens who contribute to sustainable development.
- A distinctive organization, V T Pathanakendram started programmes which aim to study social transformations by focusing on V.T. Bhattathiripad.
