PROFILE OF THE INSTITUTE

Sreekrishnapuram V. T. Bhattathiripad College, a top-tier government-aided institution, is affiliated with the University of Calicut. Established in 1982, the college caters to the rural and less developed areas of Sreekrishnapuram in Kerala's Palakkad district. Named after V. T. Bhattathiripad, a pioneering figure in Kerala's social reform movement, the college aims to advance higher education. Managed by the Sree Sankara Trust, a charitable organization dedicated to the principles of Adi Sankaracharya, the college upholds the values of the renowned Advaita Vedanta philosopher and theologian from the Namboothiri community.

The college initially began as a junior college offering two pre-degree groups. It expanded in 1991 to include a degree program with a BA in Sanskrit. In 2001, it achieved first-grade status with the introduction of an M.Sc. in Computer Science. Today, the college offers six undergraduate degree programs and three postgraduate degree programs.

The college has been recognized for its quality and adherence to standards, being listed under sections 12(B) and 2(f) of the UGC Act 1956, as confirmed by letter No: F8-91/99(CP-P-1) dated 20-03-2000 from the UGC Secretary. Additionally, it received a B+ grade re-accreditation from NAAC in 2016.


Rally against Drug Abuse




International Forest Day Celebration

TRAINING PLACEMENT CELL INITIATIVES

Work Readiness Programme

The Work Readiness Programme is a 15-hour module designed to enhance candidates' interview skills and help them articulate their thoughts confidently in front of an interview panel. The module covers interview etiquette, resume preparation, presentation skills, group discussions, jobrelated Q&A, and soft skills.

This programme was launched by the Kerala Knowledge Economy Mission (KKEM) in collaboration with ASAP Kerala. The primary objective of KKEM is to guide the youth of Kerala, enabling them to engage in global opportunities and create employment for over 2 million people.




ENTREPRENEURSHIP DEVELOPMENT CLUB


WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT CELL

Ameena demonstrated the self-defence techniques for the students. The program ended with vote of thanks by Gopika.








Activity 2: Seminar on International Day for violence against Women


Activity 4: Gender Awareness Programme

The Project was initially funded by contributing ₹5,00,000/- and ₹1,50,000 by Kerala State Bio-diversity Sreekrishnapuram Board and Grama Panchayath respectively. The remaining fund was contributed by Management and Sponsorship arranged through Nature Club Volunteers.

Concept of Food Forest

With a view to connect the people with nature and presenting a natural way for balancing the echo-system, a new concept named FOOD FOREST which is conceived by the Organic Farmers' Organization, JAIVORG, which is lead by the Plant Genome Saviour Award Winner, Sri. Reji Joseph at Sreekrishnapuram. The slogan of this Food Forest is One Solution for Seven Mission. Seven missions are 1. Bio-diversity conservation 2. Food security 3. Eco- system restoration 4. Reconnecting human and nature 5. Water preservation 6. Ecological balance and 7. Soil Enrichment. The Concept of Food Forest is a farming system that integrates the views of great Organic farmers Narendra Dabholkar, Subhash Palekar, Masanobu Fukuoka who brought new ideasin the field of agriculture into Permaculture Approach. In order to ensure the Canopy Management, one sapling is plated in every 10 feet distance so that the canopy of one plant will not disturb the canopy of another one that makes this concept a Forest. This project is a forest that gives food at all times which is a combination of pragmatic aspects of traditional and modern agricultural methods that is a golden opportunity for the students to learn and research on the topic of innovative agriculture. This is the main vision and mission of starting such a project in the college. It is essential to retake the lost culture and precious food trees back to our life. We are in deep belief that we can protect the bio diversity through the continuous maintenance of our Food Forest.




Cyber Safety Awareness Programme

Nature Inspired Algorithms for Research




